Regulatory bodies are created in the public interest, in order to safeguard the public (as workers, as consumers, and as citizens) from the abuses that are always attendant on concentrations of private power (like corporations, e.g.). In order to serve that public purpose, the regulatory body must be staffed with knowledgeable men and women who make it their daily business to know and understand not only the law, but also the industry itself which they regulate. Their work is based in science and data as well as in public policy.

This design makes sense. It is not reasonable to suppose that a member of Congress have the scientific expertise and knowledge of the industry to make sound decisions on regulation in the public interest — such things are the product only of years of study and experience. And this, in turn, is why regulatory bodies are also granted broad power to write or re-write regulations according to their best determination of the science and the public interest. If they were not so empowered, their existence would be pointless.

And that, of course, clarifies the obvious aim of the law proposed here by the Republicans (and notably concocted by Koch organizations). It is meant to render the regulatory agencies unable to pursue their purpose — to protect the public interest — by deliberately depriving them of the power to do so.

In short: the clear purpose of the law proposed is not to bring political praxis in line with the demands of the Constitution, as your simplistic construction of 'constitutionality' pretends. The purpose is to sacrifice the public interest to the profit interest of corporations — and to do so even if it means subverting over a century of historical precedent and making a mockery of Law.
